

Course Format Type Description

Teleconferencing / Videoconferencing - the speaker(s) of the educational activity is linked to the participants by either a telecommunications system or a videoconferencing system and is generally broadcast to the participants' workplace. Generally, the participants are located in one room and listening to the audio from a telecommunications set up or watching the speaker through a video or television screen. Program materials for the participants are provided separately.

Interactive Webcast - an interactive, web-based, real-time broadcast with audio and video streaming on-line from the program location that allows participants to ask questions of or otherwise interact with the speaker(s) on-line. Materials for the program participants are downloadable or provided separately.

On-line Internet Presentation - a webinar/webcast/web conference broadcast that reaches the participant in the convenience of his or her home or office using a computer with an internet connection and, often, a phone line. This alternative learning format does not allow for audience participation through speaker questioning or attendee interactivity with the presenter(s) of the course and is either given on a specific day and time or can be viewed at the participant's convenience. Materials for the program participants are downloadable or provided separately.

Satellite Simulcast - an educational activity broadcast real-time through radio or television and transmitted to one or more locations. Program materials are provided to participants separately.

Video/Audio/DVD/MP3 - video, audio, DVD or MP3 reproductions of approved live courses or broadcasts that are viewed or listened to individually at the participant's convenience or in a monitored group setting. Materials for the program are provided to the participants separately.

Internet Computer Self-Study - the use of videos, DVDs, audio or other reproductions of live or other approved educational activities that are accessible/viewable through the internet. Materials for the program participants are downloadable or provided separately.
